



## **Grammar Skills Mini-Lesson**

**Topic:** Parts of Speech, Sentence Types, and Common Grammar Errors

**Level:** Grades 4–7 / Intermediate ESL

**Format:** Quick classroom or remote mini-lesson with quiz + worksheet

### **Learning Objectives**

By the end of this lesson, students will be able to:

- Identify basic parts of speech (nouns, adjectives, pronouns, conjunctions)
- Correctly use subject–verb agreement in simple sentences
- Recognize sentence types and avoid common grammar mistakes
- Apply knowledge through an interactive quiz and group discussion

### **Time Required**

15–20 minutes

*(or extended to 30 min with worksheet practice)*

### **Materials Needed**

- Printed or projected version of [Grammatical Skills Quiz](#)
- Whiteboard or chart paper

- Pens/pencils
- Optional: PDF worksheet or slide deck for extension

## Lesson Procedure

### 1. Warm-Up (3 minutes)

Ask students:

“What’s one grammar mistake people make all the time?”

Write 2–3 answers on the board (e.g., its/it’s, subject–verb mismatch, double negatives).

### 2. Mini-Lesson (5 minutes)

Briefly explain or review:

- Parts of speech (noun, adjective, verb, pronoun, conjunction)
- What makes a sentence “simple”
- Subject–verb agreement (singular/plural)
- Common mistakes: double negatives, wrong punctuation

#### Visual aid suggestion:

Create a simple sentence and label each part.

*“The small dog runs quickly.”*

### 3. Interactive Quiz (7–10 minutes)

- Project or distribute the **Grammar Skills Quiz**
- Students can work individually or in pairs
- Go over each question and **discuss the answers**
- Ask: “Why is that the best answer?” for 2–3 tricky items

### 4. Wrap-Up Discussion (2–3 minutes)

Ask:

- Which types of questions were hardest?
- One grammar rule they want to practice more

ESL / lower level	Provide sentence frames, use matching or visual grammar cards
Advanced students	Challenge: write a sentence using 3 parts of speech correctly
Homework option	Have students correct 3 grammar mistakes from a made-up paragraph (or use worksheet)
