

Lesson Plan: *Understanding and Using English Metaphors*

Grade Level / CEFR: Grades 6–10 / ESL B1–B2 Time: 60 minutes Topic: English Metaphors — Definition, Examples, and Usage Materials Needed:

- TeachersInstruction.com article printout or projection
- Printable worksheet (matching + fill-in-the-blank)
- Whiteboard/markers or digital board
- Student notebooks
- Optional: Metaphor generator (in the article)

Learning Objectives

By the end of this lesson, students will be able to:

- 1. Define what a metaphor is and how it differs from a simile or idiom.
- 2. Identify metaphors in context and explain their meaning.
- 3. Use metaphors in their own writing or speaking to describe emotions, situations, or abstract ideas.

🝈 Lesson Breakdown

Time	Stage	Activities & Notes
5 min	Warm-Up	Ask: "Have you ever said 'time is money' or 'he's a night owl'?" Write on board. Elicit responses: <i>What do these really mean?</i>
10 min	Mini-Lesson (Definition)	Use article's intro and definition section . Write this on board: Metaphor = a direct comparison (X is Y) without using "like" or "as." Project or read: "Her smile is sunshine."
10 min	Compare & Contrast	Use the comparison table : Metaphor vs. Simile vs. Idiom. Guide students through matching example pairs. Students copy table in notebooks.
15 min	Guided Practice	Distribute worksheet: Matching quiz + fill-in-the-blank. Have students work in pairs. (You can pull examples from your article's themed sections: Love, Life, Growth.)
10 min	Creative Application	Use whiteboard prompt: "Write your own metaphor about an emotion, a season, or a challenge." Students write 1–2 sentences, share in pairs or aloud.
5 min	Review & Exit Ticket	Ask: "What's one metaphor you remember from today? What does it mean?" Collect or share aloud. Optionally, give a 3-question review quiz.

Assessment

Tool / Format	Criteria
Worksheet (matching/fill-in)	80%+ accuracy for identifying metaphors
Creative sentence	Includes metaphor structure (X is Y), appropriate and original
Exit Ticket / Share Out	Demonstrates understanding of metaphor meaning

📚 Extensions / Homework

• **Creative writing prompt:** Write a short paragraph using 2 metaphors about your day.

• **Metaphor scavenger hunt:** Find 3 metaphors in a song or poem and explain their meaning.
